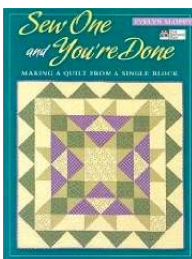

Each quilt features one super-sized block. Using just three to five fabrics and large pieces, you can whip up a beautiful traditional quilt in no time. The book contains 20 projects that range in size from 45" to 56" square and by adding plain or pieced borders you can make the designs even larger or sew blocks together and make bed-sized quilts. It's fun, it's easy and it's quick. Check it out!

We wish them a speedy recovery and hope to see them back with us soon.

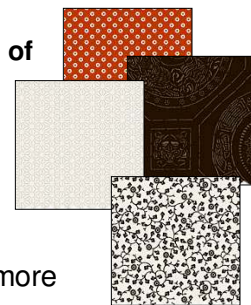
## FAT QUARTERS DRAWING

*This year we will be highlighting the wonderful luncheons our quilters provide and the recipes we all want. So look for your favorites right here each month in your newsletter!*

Lana Nufer has had this recipe for about 30 years and she can't remember where she got it from. This is a family favorite of hers. She likes to try different kinds of meat in this recipe, but so far she loves meatballs the best.

So use your imagination and have fun with this one.

### Sweet and Sour Sauce

1 Tbs. oil  
1 cup pineapple juice

Cook over low heat a few minutes. Add a mixture of:

3 Tbs. cornstarch  
3 Tbs. vinegar  
1/2 cup sugar  
3 Tbs. soy sauce  
6 Tbs. water

Cook until juice thickens, stirring constantly. Add meat, pineapple chunks, green peppers, chopped onions.

Other Meat ideas:

Pork chunks  
Chicken chunks  
Meatballs

You can use this sauce over rice, noodles, or all by itself.

### TIPS & TECHNIQUES

Rotary Blade tips:

1. When you put in a new blade, mark the date on it with a permanent marker so you know when you changed it last.
2. Always use a cutter with a sharp blade.
3. Always close the cutter when you set it down. This will save the blade and your fingers!
