NOT-QUITE-HOMEMADE STUFFING

(From Kathy Fazio)

1/3 cup finely chopped onion
1/3 cup finely chopped celery
3-1/3 cups water
2 chicken bouillon cubes
1 tsp. dried parsley flakes
1 stick (1/2 cup) margarine or butter
2 6-oz. pkgs. Stove-Top (or store brand) chicken flavored stuffing mix

Chop onion and celery. Place in large pot with the water, bouillon cubes, parsley and butter. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer for 1-2 minutes until vegetables are tender. Add stuffing mix; stir and cover. Remove from heat; let stand 5 minutes. Fluff with fork and serve. (Instead of bouillon cubes, you can replace some of the water with an equal amount of chicken broth.)
