TIPS & TECHNIQUES

It is always advisable to use a specially made fabric marker when marking fabric for quilt-making. If you use a marker that is not intended for fabric then it may not wash off and can spoil the overall appearance of your beautiful quilt.

Depending on the fabric composition, you may choose to use pencils, chalk or water-soluble markers. If at any one time you are unsure, mark a small scrap of the same material, wash and see if you are happy with the results.

This is a simple challenge. There are 10 things to include in your quilt:

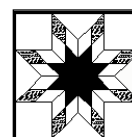
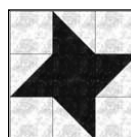
1. A piece of striped fabric
2. A curve somewhere in the quilt (A crooked straight line counts)

The idea here is to just have fun and see what your imagination can come up with.

We hope everyone will make a "TEN" quilt this year. What fun that would be!

OUT TO LUNCH...

Internet Taco Soup

serves 12 - 16

prep time - about 15 minutes

cook time - 1 hour on stove or 6-8 hours in crock pot

this is a mild recipe, if you like it hotter add jalapenos to taste

Step 1:
 2 lbs ground beef
 2 cups diced onions
 Step 2:
 2 (15 1/2 oz) cans pinto beans
 1 (15 1/2 oz) can kidney beans
 1 (15 1/2 oz) can whole kernel corn
 2 (14 1/2 oz) can Mexican style stewed tomatoes
 1 (14 1/2 oz) can diced tomatoes
 2 (4 1/2 oz) cans diced green chiles
 1 (4.6 oz) can sliced black olives
 1 (1 1/4 oz) package taco seasoning
 1 (1 oz) package ranch salad dressing seasoning mix
 Step 3:
 Corn chips for serving
 Step 4:
 Garnish: (as desired) sour cream, grated cheese, sliced green onions, pickled jalapenos

Directions:
 1. Brown meat and onions; drain excess fat 2. transfer to stock pot (or crock pot) and add rest of step 2 ingredients. stir to mix. Bring to boil, then simmer about 1 hour over low heat in stockpot or cook 6 - 8 hours on low in a crock pot.
 3. Serve with corn chips
 4. Garnish with desired toppings
